When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered around him; and he was by the sea. Then one of the leaders of the synagogue named Jairus came and, when he saw him, fell at his feet and begged him repeatedly, "My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well, and live." So he went with him. And a large crowd followed him and pressed in on him. Now there was a woman who had been suffering from haemorrhages for twelve years. She had endured much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had; and she was no better, but rather grew worse. She had heard about Jesus, and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, for she said, "If I but touch his clothes, I will be made well." Immediately her haemorrhage stopped; and she felt in her body that she was

healed of her disease. Immediately aware that power had gone forth from him, Jesus turned about in the crowd and said, "Who touched my clothes?" And his disciples said to him, "You see the crowd pressing in on you; how can you say, 'Who touched me?'" He looked all around to see who had done it. But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling, fell down before him, and told him the whole truth. He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease." While he was still speaking, some people came from the leader's house to say, "Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the teacher any further?" But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the leader of the synagogue, "Do not fear, only believe." He allowed no one to follow him except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they came to the house of the leader of the synagogue, he saw a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. When he had entered, he said to them, "Why do you make a commotion and weep? The child is not dead but sleeping." And they laughed at him. Then he put them all outside, and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him, and went in where the child was. He took her by the hand and said to her, "Talitha cum," which means, "Little girl, get up!" And immediately the girl got up and began to walk about (she was twelve years of age). At this they were overcome with amazement. He strictly ordered them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat.

Dear Friends,

July 4th is our re-entry into the beautiful building we call our church home. With a 15% limit and the physical distance requirement, we can accommodate 60 people, including the clergy and other staff. If you would like to worship in person, please register online so that we may keep track of numbers and

continue contact tracing. For the time being there will be one liturgy at 9:15 AM each Sunday. Eventually, we will return to our full schedule of liturgies when more people are double vaccinated, when pandemic restrictions are further loosened, and when many of our parishioners return to the city after their vacations.

We encourage parishioners to get their vaccinations, and those who feel safe to attend worship may [CLICK HERE TO REGISTER](#) and join us at church each Sunday, beginning July 4th at 9:15AM. Our Wednesday morning worship will resume July 14th at 7:30 AM. Online registration will not be required for that liturgy.

Please remember that whenever you are in the church, you will be required to wear a mask that covers your mouth and nose, and you will sit six feet apart from each other, regardless of your vaccination status. In other words, double vaccination does not exempt you from mask-wearing and physical distancing.

Message from the CCDP Management Team!

Greetings from the CCDP Management Team! We are a group of seven that includes our beloved rector, Cheryl and the team of wardens and the treasurer (Andrew van Nostrand – Rector's Warden, Katherine MacDonald – People's Warden, Nick Strube – Treasurer, and Michael Butler, Stephen Clark, Paul Kingston as Deputy Wardens). We are delighted to announce that CCDP's new Pastoral Associate, Ali McIntosh, will also be joining the MT as a non-voting member. We have been meeting regularly (often bi-weekly) since the annual Vestry Meeting in late February and we wanted to give you a quick update as we head into our summer season.

A key starting point for the new MT was the holding of a Strategic Planning session in late March in which we determined several priorities for the year – among them being the fostering of a stronger parish community, continuing to develop our parish outreach and social justice work, renewing our foundations through parish education, and modernizing our parish operations.

To facilitate the pursuit of these goals, the MT also designated each member with a governance 'portfolio' around the themes of Finance (Michael), Property (Andrew), Governance (Stephen), Worship and Spiritual Care (Paul), and Administration and Operations (Katherine). We hope that the creation of these portfolios will help to better coordinate and energize the work of the many parishioners who are already doing such amazing work on the ground in these areas. To start this process, the MT will be hosting an Advisory Board 'Zoom' meeting in the very near future.

The financial position of the parish is looking slightly improved despite the challenges presented by the pandemic – thanks in large part to the generosity of the Moore family and the amazing response of our parishioners to the Moore Family Challenge that raised roughly \$250,000. This is earmarked for both capital repairs and the financing of the deficit which is now projected to be \$123,000 - \$58,000 smaller than expected. The MT plans for further fundraising activities in the fall of 2021.

Finally, the MT wants to remind everyone to look out for the date of our 'Welcome Back' Barbeque in early September, in the hopes that we will all be able to congregate in person again at that time. In the meantime, the MT wishes you all a blessed and restorative summer!

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We acknowledge that the land on which we worship is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee (*ho-den-oh-show-nee*), and Anishinabek (*ah-nish-nah-bek*) Nations, and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. This territory is part of the *Dish with One Spoon Treaty*, an agreement between the Anishinabek, Haudenosaunee, and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes.

Today, Toronto is still home to many Indigenous people from across Turtle Island (*North America*) and we seek to live in respect, peace, and right relations with them as we meet and worship on this territory. We are grateful for the resources we are using, and honour all the First Nations, Métis, and Inuit people who have been living on this land since time immemorial.
