Thursday, September 30, 2021 was the first National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. It is a public commemoration of the lost children and Survivors of residential schools, their families and communities, and is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

It is also Orange Shirt Day, which reflects the experience of Phyllis Webstad, a Northern Secwpemc (Shuswap) from the Stswecem'cXgat'tem First Nation, whose new orange shirt was taken from her when she arrived on her first day of school. The orange shirt is now a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by indigenous children over generations.
