Readings

Reader: A Reading from the Book of Esther

So the king and Haman went to dinner with Queen Esther. At this second dinner, while they were drinking wine the king again asked, “Queen Esther, what would you like? Half of my kingdom! Just ask and it’s yours.” Queen Esther answered, “If I have found favor in your eyes, O King, and if it please the king, give me my life, and give my people their lives. “We’ve been sold, I and my people, to be destroyed—sold to be massacred, eliminated. If we had just been sold off into slavery, I wouldn’t even have brought it up; our troubles wouldn’t have been worth bothering the king over.” King Xerxes exploded, “Who? Where is he? This is monstrous!” “An enemy. An adversary. This evil Haman,” said Esther. Haman was terror-stricken before the king and queen.

Harbona, one of the eunuchs attending the king, spoke up: “Look over there! There’s the gallows that Haman had built for Mordecai, who saved the king’s life. It’s right next to Haman’s house—seventy-five feet high!” The king said, “Hang him on it!” So Haman was hanged on the very gallows that he had built for Mordecai. And the king’s hot anger cooled.

Mordecai wrote all this down and sent copies to all the Jews in all King Xerxes’ provinces, regardless of distance, calling for an annual celebration on the fourteenth and fifteenth days of Adar as the occasion when Jews got relief from their enemies, the month in which their sorrow turned to joy, mourning somersaulted into a holiday for parties and fun and laughter, the sending and receiving of presents and of giving gifts to the poor.

Are you hurting? Pray. Do you feel great? Sing. Are you sick? Call the church leaders together to pray and anoint you with oil in the name of the Master. Believing-prayer will heal you, and Jesus will put you on your feet. And if you've sinned, you'll be forgiven—healed inside and out. Make this your common practice: Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you can live together whole and healed. The prayer of a person living right with God is something powerful to be reckoned with. Elijah, for instance, human just like us, prayed hard that it wouldn't rain, and it didn't—not a drop for three and a half years. Then he prayed that it would rain, and it did. The showers came and everything started growing again. My dear friends, if you know people who have wandered off from God's truth, don't write them off. Go after them. Get them back and you will have rescued precious lives from destruction and prevented an epidemic of wandering away from God.

Dear Friends,

It's here! Two weeks ago, Bishop Asbil informed us that a vaccination policy for the Diocese of Toronto was about to be launched, and now it is here. The wardens and I have been informed that the policy requires all "clergy, diocesan employees, parish employees and volunteers to show proof of vaccination against COVID-19. [This applies to] every bishop, priest, deacon, and lay person under the jurisdiction of the Diocesan Bishop of the Diocese of Toronto engaged as an office holder, employee, service provider or volunteer."

The policy will be effective as of **September 30, 2021**. Therefore, any employee, member of the clergy or volunteer who does ministry on our premises must show proof of being vaccinated with two doses of a vaccine or combination of vaccines approved by Health Canada, with the second dose having been administered at least two weeks prior to the in-person attendance.

How does this affect parishioners? Simply. If you do **anything** at Christ Church Deer Park (read in church, lead prayers, pour a cup of coffee, bake a scone, arrange flowers, serve breakfast, sing in the choir, sit on a committee, teach Church School, participate in a bible study, pick up collection... any ministry whatsoever), you will need to show proof of vaccination to continue your participation in the ministry. The people who are exempt from showing proof of vaccination are those who attend worship only, they are not involved in **any** ministry.

The implementation of this policy is the responsibility of our two wardens, Andrew van Nostrand and Katherine MacDonald. They will be the people to whom you **show** proof of vaccination. They will not need a copy. The wardens simply have to see it and therefore confirm that you are fully vaccinated. However, because they are not present every time a member walks through the door to sort rummage or wash the altar linens or attend a meeting, the proof of vaccination is being collected at a specific time from everyone. They will record and keep that information in a place that is only accessible to them. To that end, you will be invited to attend one of two Zoom meetings next week, to show your vaccination certificate to Katherine and Andrew. This will take mere seconds. We hope to cover all our volunteers over a two-day period.

Your ministry is valued at Christ Church, and I therefore hope you will join us next week to show your proof of vaccination.

Pets and owners of all religious backgrounds are welcome!

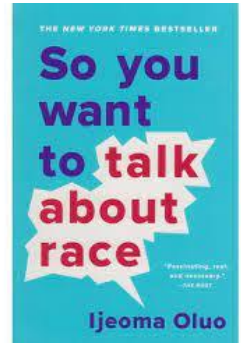
