Reading

Reader

Our first reading is from *Embers*, written by Richard Wagamese, a Canadian author of the Wabaseemoong Independent Nations, Northwest Ontario.

On a windy day in summer many summers ago, a hawk hurtled straight down at me. Ten feet above my head, she spread her wings and stopped in mid dive. I heard the whoosh of her wings against the sound of the wind and the exhalation of my own breath. Three things collided in an instant: wind, hawk, breath. There was no separation. We were connected. Joined by air. In the flash of that sacred moment, I understood what it is to be alive: to be connected, to be aware of that connection, to be grateful for it. To breathe is to take in the wind of all breath. To exhale slowly is to open myself and glide over everything I feel.

Refrain: Heaven and earth tell your glory, almighty God.

The heavens proclaim your glory, O God,
And the firmament shows forth the work of your hands.
Day unto day takes up the story
And night unto night makes known the message.
No speech, no word, no voice is heard,
