Presider:	<i>The presider marks a cross on the forehead of each candidate saying</i> <i>Azure, Zara, Elsa, Sabine, Hunter</i> receive the sign of the cross on your forehead and in your heart, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Celebrating the Eucharist

The Great Thanksgiving

- Presider: The Lord be with you.

Presider: We give you thanks and praise, gracious God, through your beloved Son Jesus Christ, your living Word through whom you have created all things;

Who was sent by you, in your great goodness, to be our Saviour. By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh and, as your Son, born of the blessed Virgin, was seen on earth and went about among us.

He opened wide his arms for us on the cross; he put an end to death by dying for us and revealed the resurrection by rising to new life; so he fulfilled your will and won for you a holy people.

And now we give you thanks for the hope to which you call us in your Son, that following in the faith of all your saints, we may run with perseverance the race that I set before us, and with them receive the unfading crown of glory.

Presider: Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all goodness; grant that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these your gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ;

Who in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.
