

Coffee Hour Postponed


The good news: we are back to worshipping in person.

An Advent Study

Explore Advent through the stories of Zechariah and Elizabeth, Mary, the journey to Bethlehem and the visit from the Magi. Written and presented by Dr. Amy-Jill Levine, Professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies at Vanderbilt Divinity School, the internationally renowned scholar and teacher breaks open the birth narratives for us to engage in rich Advent discussions. Through videos and conversations, we will explore the relationship of the Gospel stories to the Old Testament, the role of women in first-century Jewish culture, the importance of Mary's visitation and the revolutionary implications of Mary's Magnificat, the census and the stable, the star of Bethlehem and the flight to Egypt. Dear friends at Christ Church Deer Park,

After prayerful discernment and careful deliberation, I have made the difficult decision to resign from my position as Interim Music Director at Christ Church Deer Park. My final Sunday will be November 21, Reign of Christ Sunday.

You may be aware that my professional pursuits are diverse, and include theological scholarship and music education as well as choral conducting and church music ministry. I have recently accepted two new opportunities: lecturing in sacred music and conducting a University Schola Cantorum. While I am excited about the professional advancement these new opportunities offer, I am also aware that they require me to make some tough decisions about letting other responsibilities go.

With the recent exciting and long-awaited news that the diocese is reintroducing choral singing, there are signs of hope for music in the church. I feel that this natural period of adjustment is the right time to move on from my ministry at Christ Church Deer Park. It is my hope that my leaving at the end of the liturgical year will allow my successor to have a fresh start for Advent and Christmas.

I began ministering at CCDP in September 2020, in the midst of a very uncertain and tumultuous time. I have sought during my tenure at the church to provide and coordinate beautiful and uplifting music for worship, to keep the choir connected and engaged, and to navigate the challenges of online and hybrid liturgies. I remain deeply grateful for the invaluable experiences of liturgical music leadership, the relationships I have formed, and the opportunities to grow and develop as a pastoral musician. In particular, I wish to thank Cheryl and the ministry staff, the wardens, the wonderful leads, musicians, and choir for the joy of their collaboration. I thank you all for your kindness, support and prayers.






Thursday December 2nd at 7 pm
