The Greeting

Officiant: Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ
 be with you.

All: And also with you.

Officiant: This is the day that the Lord has made.

All: Let us rejoice and be glad in it.

Officiant: We gather today to hear and receive God's holy word and to pray for the needs of
the world, remembering especially the people of Ukraine. We gather with the
jarring images of the waste and ruin of war in Ukraine, to honour the people of

that war-shattered landscape and pray for peace in their land. We honour those who have died; those who are showing great courage and loyalty to their country; those who are seeing unspeakable sights of bodies broken; those whose minds are numbed by the noise of bombardment, and those whose eyes have seen the sadness of weeping and frightened faces. For all who are engaged in combat, those who tend the maimed and injured, the fallen, and for those families who now hold the memories of deceased fighters, we ask for God's mercy, and for ourselves, the grace to give ourselves in service to God's people in Ukraine and to keep them in our hearts and prayers.

Confession and Absolution

Officiant: In light of the invasion and atrocities in Ukraine, it is easy for us to be self-righteous, as we point fingers at the evil-doers, so as we name and confess to God the sins and shortcomings of the world; its pride, its selfishness, its greed; its evil divisions and hatreds, let us also confess our share in what is wrong, and our failure to seek and establish that peace which God wills for all God's children. Let us kneel to pray.

All: O God, gladly we live and move and have our being in you. Yet always in the midst of this creation-glory, we see sin's shadow and feel death's darkness: around us in the earth, sea and sky, beside us in the broken, the hungry and the poor, the betrayal and abuse of one another; and often, deep within us, a striving against your Spirit. We have sinned in thought, word and deed. We have not loved you with our whole heart. We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves.

O Trinity of love, in your mercy forgive what we have been, help us to amend what we are, and direct what we shall be that we may do justly, love mercy, walk humbly with you, and be makers of peace, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Officiant: May the God of all mercies cleanse you from your sins, and restore you in his image to the praise and glory of his name, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The Peace

Please stand

Officiant: Lord Jesus Christ, you said to your apostles, "Peace I give to you; my own peace I leave with you." Regard not our sins, but the faith of your Church, and give to us the peace and unity of that heavenly city, where with the Father and the Holy Spirit you live and reign, now and forever.

Officiant: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All: And also with you.

Officiant: Blessed are you, Lord our God,
creator and redeemer of all;
to you be glory and praise for ever.
From the waters of chaos, you drew forth the world
and in your great love fashioned us in your image.
Now, through the deep waters of death,
you have brought your people to new birth
by raising your Son to life in triumph.

Psalm 35, Selected verses

Leader: Contend, O LORD, with those who contend with me; fight against those who fight against me! Take hold of shield and buckler and rise up to help me!

All: Let them be put to shame and dishonor who seek after my life. Let them be turned back and confounded who devise evil against me.

Leader: For without cause, they hid their net for me; without cause, they dug a pit for my life. Let ruin come on them unawares. And let the net that they hid ensnare them; let them fall in it—to their ruin.

All: Then my soul shall rejoice in the LORD, exulting in his deliverance. All my bones shall say, “O LORD, who is like you? You deliver the weak from those too strong for them, the weak and needy from those who despoil them.”

Leader: Then I will thank you in the great congregation; in the mighty throng I will praise you.

All: Do not let my treacherous enemies rejoice over me, or those who hate me without cause wink the eye.

Leader: For they do not speak peace, but they conceive deceitful words against those who are quiet in the land.

All: Vindicate me, O LORD, my God, according to your righteousness, and do not let them rejoice over me.

Leader: Do not let them say to themselves, “Aha, we have our heart’s desire.” Do not let them say, “We have swallowed you up.”

All: Let all those who rejoice at my calamity be put to shame and confusion; let those who exalt themselves against me be clothed with shame and dishonour.

Leader: Let those who desire my vindication shout for joy and be glad, and say evermore, “Great is the LORD, who delights in the welfare of his servant.” Then my tongue shall tell of your righteousness and of your praise all day long.

1st Lesson James 3:13-18 (*Read in Ukrainian*)

Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace.

All: We believe and celebrate the promise of plenty and peace.

Officiant: In the midst of oppression and tyranny

All: We believe and celebrate the promise of service and freedom.

Officiant: In the midst of doubt and despair

All: We believe and celebrate the promise of faith and hope.

Officiant: In the midst of fear and betrayal

All: We believe and celebrate the promise of joy and loyalty.

Officiant: In the midst of hatred and death

All: We believe and celebrate the promise of love and life.

Officiant: In the midst of sin and decay

All: We believe and celebrate the promise of salvation and renewal.

Officiant: In the midst of death on every side

All: We believe and celebrate the promise of the living Christ. Amen.

Leader: Let us pray for all who suffer as a result of war and ask that God may give us peace: for the men and women who have died in the violence of the invasion of Ukraine, each one remembered by and known to God; may God give peace.

Leader: For those who love them in death as in life, offering the distress of our grief and the sadness of our loss; may God give peace.

All: God give peace.

Leader: For all members of the Ukrainian and Russian armed forces who are in danger this day, remembering family, friends and all who pray for their safe return; may God give peace.

All: God give peace.

Leader: For civilian women, children and men whose lives are disfigured by war or terror, calling to mind in penitence the anger and hatreds of humanity; may God give peace.

All: God give peace.

Leader: For peacemakers and peacekeepers, who seek to keep this world secure and free; may God give peace.

All: God give peace.

Leader: For all who bear the privilege and burden of leadership, political, military and religious; asking for gifts of wisdom and resolve in the search for reconciliation and peace; may God give peace.

All: God give peace.

Leader: O God of truth and justice, we hold before you those whose memory we cherish, and those whose names we will never know. Help us to lift our eyes above the torment of this broken world and grant us the grace to pray for those who wish to harm others; for you are the source of life and hope, now and for ever.

All: Amen.

Leader: God of mercy, by whose grace
in all who suffer is Christ crucified,
we pray for the people of Ukraine who live in danger.
They are a people who know oppression, injustice and fear,
whose land has been invaded,
and whose home is unsafe.
Be with them and shelter them in your love;
give them courage and hope;
enfold them in your grace.
Touch their wounds; heal their trauma.
May the strength of the earth be theirs,
the freedom of the sky, the peace of the trees.
We bear in our hearts all who are afraid.
May they bear our love in theirs, for we are one.
In the unity of your Holy Spirit
you hold us together as one humanity,
one world, one body, one hope.
May your peace change the hearts
of those who misuse power.
And may the peace of Christ
be with us all.

Guide us by your Spirit; give us wisdom; give us courage, give us hope; and keep us faithful now and always. Amen.**

Officiant: O God our light and our defence,
breathe your gentle Spirit over the wastes of our world.
Protect our memories from the infection of hate,
that we may live free from fear and resentment.
May the light of Christ lead us
out of the valley of the shadow of death
onto paths of reconciliation, forgiveness and peace
for the sake of the world your Son came to save.

All: Amen.

Officiant: Gathering our prayers and praises into one, as our Saviour taught us, so we pray
All: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. She wrote this poem after her community was embroiled in conflict with Russia in 2014. Sadly, the war poem of that time is still relevant today. Before the recent Russian invasion of Ukraine, Lyuba Yakimchuk and her husband attended civilian military training, stocked up on food and installed an electric generator. They plan to stay in Kyiv to donate blood for Ukrainian soldiers and ‘try to be helpful.’
