



Mid-Year Financial Update:

- Our revenues, both givings and rental income, are holding steady
- Our administrative expenses are up due to staff changes
- Overall we are tracking to have a deficit of approximately \$200,000 by end of year, compared with the budgeted deficit of \$164,400.

Truth and Reconciliation Working Group

June is both National Indigenous History Month and Pride Month. You may have seen the term "Two-Spirit" or noticed the short form "2S" in acronyms like LGBTQ2S and wondered exactly what it means.



Before European colonization, many Indigenous cultures had people in their communities who did not conform to the typical male or female dress, behaviour, or social roles, either taking on the roles normally assumed by someone of the opposite sex, or belonging to a specific third or other gender. These people often held a special status and spiritual role within the community and many Indigenous languages have specific names for them.

The term "Two-Spirit" is a modern term that was invented by Indigenous people who identify with these roles, and is intended to give a common name to their identity no matter what their Indigenous Nation is. The name comes from the concept of two spirits – male and female – residing in the same person, but the term is broad and means different things to different people.

Two-spirit people may also identify themselves as trans, or label their sexuality as gay, lesbian, pan or bisexual, but not all do. No matter how a specific a Two-Spirit person defines the term for themselves, it is a distinctly Indigenous identity that refers to a long history of cultural and spiritual traditions.
