Listening to God

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While staying with them,

he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." *Acts 1:1-11*

Truth and Reconciliation Working Group

The Land Acknowledgment of Christ Church Deer Park states that the land on which we worship is part of the *Dish with One Spoon Treaty*, an agreement between the Anishinabek, Haudenosaunee and allied Nations. The term '*Dish with One Spoon*' has often been referred to by Indigenous nations when making treaties with each other. The '*dish*' represents the land that is to be shared peacefully, and the '*spoon*' represents the individuals living on and using the resources of the land in a spirit of mutual co-operation. The understanding was that the land would be shared by all parties signing the treaty, but that each party would maintain their sovereignty.





The Wilderness Committee reports a 22% increase in Ontario of species endangered/ at risk (Blanding's turtle, Jefferson salamander, caribou, Algonquin wolf, lake sturgeon, red-headed woodpecker and bobolink). The cause: a 6000% increase in approvals of development, buildings and industrial projects by an industry and lobbyist dominated advisory committee. Wildlife must be protected by a science-based approach to recovery.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We acknowledge that the land on which we worship is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee (*ho-den-oh-shownee*), and Anishinabek (*ah-nish-nahbek*) Nations, and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. This territory is part of the *Dish with One Spoon Treaty*, an agreement between the Anishinabek, Haudenosaunee, and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes.

Today, Toronto is still home to many Indigenous people from across Turtle Island (North America) and we seek to live in respect, peace, and right relations with them as we meet and worship on this territory. We are grateful for the resources we are using, and honour all the First Nations, Métis, and Inuit people who have been living on this land since time immemorial.
