
Presider:



CCDP is now a Battery Recycling Collection Location!

Our church is now an *official* battery recycling collection station for the City. Batteries will be collected on an ongoing basis and sent to the City once every three months. The battery collection box is in the Atrium entrance.

WHERE'S THE PARKING STAMP??

We have heard this question on a number of occasions, and the short answer is that the church no longer has free Sunday parking at the nearby Green P garage. About one year ago the City informed the church that our free Sunday parking privileges were ending. This occurred during the peak of COVID when the building was closed and there were no in-person services. As such, the message was not passed on to the congregation at that time. You can still use the parking facilities across Heath Street, subject to the regular fees.




