





Mid-Year Financial Update:

- Our revenues, both givings and rental income, are holding steady
- Our administrative expenses are up due to staff changes
- Overall we are tracking to have a deficit of approximately \$200,000 by end of year, compared with the budgeted deficit of \$164,400.
- The Wardens continue to monitor the projected deficit and are exploring options for increasing revenue which include discussions with the Stewardship Committee

Truth and Reconciliation Working Group

As mentioned last week, the Canada-US border does not align with the traditional territorial boundaries of Indigenous groups. You can see this very clearly using the map on the Native Land website (https://native-land.ca/, also available as an app). Native Land is an interactive digital map of traditional Indigenous territories across the world. The map also shows language groups



and treaties. You can look up an address (such as your home, your cottage, or where you were born) to learn which Indigenous Nations have traditionally used that land as their territory; you can also click on the names of those Nations to learn more about them and their history.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We acknowledge that the land on which we worship is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee (ho-den-oh-show-nee), and Anishinabek (ah-nish-nah-bek) Nations, and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit.
