As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the universe, and not according to Christ. For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, and you have come to fullness in him, who is the head of every ruler and authority. In him also you were circumcised with a spiritual circumcision, by putting off the body of the flesh in the circumcision of Christ; when you were buried with him in baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. And when you were dead in trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive together with him, when he forgave us all our trespasses, erasing the record that stood against us with its legal demands. He set this aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and made a public example of them, triumphing over them in it. Therefore do not let anyone condemn you in matters of food and drink or of observing festivals, new moons, or sabbaths. These are only a shadow of what is to come, but the substance belongs to Christ. Do not let anyone disqualify you, insisting on self-abasement and worship of angels, dwelling on visions, puffed up without cause by a human way of thinking, and not holding fast to the head, from whom the whole body, nourished and held together by its ligaments and sinews, grows with a growth that is from God. Colossians 2:6-19







Truth and Reconciliation Working Group

As the Pope visits Canada, it is worth noting that papal actions affected Indigenous peoples long before the establishment of residential schools, dating back many centuries to when the Pope was head of the entire western Christian church. In the 1400s, a series of Papal Bulls – a type of public decree by the Pope



- were written that granted Christian monarchs dominion over any lands not already claimed by other Christian rulers. In other words, land that was settled by Indigenous or other non-Christian peoples could simply be taken by any European leader who claimed it. These decrees led to the development of the "Doctrine of Discovery," a legal concept that essentially regarded Europeans as the 'discoverers' of Indigenous-held land. This legal concept has been used by, for example, the U.S. Supreme Court to deny Indigenous peoples sovereignty over their traditional lands.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We acknowledge that the land on which we worship is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee (ho-den-oh-show-nee), and Anishinabek (ah-nish-nah-bek) Nations, and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit.
