The results are in Christ Church chose an OAK tree!

It was a close vote - thank you to everyone who voted and donated! We raised \$5,460.

An oak tree is extremely valuable for many species of insects and other wildlife. By planting an oak tree, we're basically planting a tree that will become a heritage tree of the future.

Some of the insect species that have a special relationship with oaks: larval host for banded hairstreak, southern hairstreak, white-m hairstreak, striped hairstreak, coral hairstreak, Edwards' hairstreak, sleepy duskywing, Horace's duskywing, Juvenal's duskywing and white admiral/red-spotted purpose butterflies, and ilia underwing, curve-lined looper, eclipsed oak dagger, polyphemus, waved sphnix, American dunbar, yellow-based tussock, mottled euchlaena, variable oakleaf caterpillar, cecropia, Georgian prominent, confused meganola, mottled prominent, oak beauty, red-lined panopoda, common oak, common tan wave, figure-eight sallow, morning glory prominent, unicorn caterpillar, white-headed prominent, acorn and hundreds more.

Truth and Reconciliation Working Group

In addition to the Indian Residential Schools in Canada, there was a network of nearly 700 Indian Day Schools that were run by the Canadian government and the Roman Catholic, Anglican, United and Presbyterian churches. These schools were located in every province and territory, except Newfoundland, and were attended by an estimated 200,000 Indigenous students between 1870 and 2000. These schools were often located on reserves, where students could return



home at the end of the day. The Indigenous communities had no influence over the operation or curriculum of these schools. Both the Residential Schools and the Day Schools shared the goal of eliminating Indigenous language and culture. However, the Indian Day School students were not included in the *Indian Residential Schools Settlement Agreement*.

In 2009, a class action lawsuit was filed against Canada to seek compensation for the harm suffered by Indigenous students forced to attend Federal Indian Day Schools and Federal Day Schools across Canada. On August 19, 2019, the Federal Court approved a nation-wide Class Action Settlement to compensate Claimants. The *McLean Day School Settlement Corporation* was established with a \$200 million legacy fund to support "language and culture, healing and wellness, commemoration and truth telling". To date, more than 150,000 survivors have made claims, and the deadline for applications of Claims has been extended to January 13, 2023.
