The Great Thanksgiving

Presider: The Lord be with you.

Presider: We give you thanks and praise, almighty God, through your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, our Saviour and Redeemer. He is your living Word, through whom you have created all things.

The Blood of Christ is back!

*After nearly three years of Covid protocol, that prevented us from using the common cup at
communion, we are reintroducing wine at our Eucharistic liturgies.*

*It is completely optional whether or not you receive wine from the common cup. Church teaching tells
us that partaking of the consecrated wine OR bread is a full and complete Eucharistic experience. You
are invited to restart taking wine, but there is nothing compulsory about receiving it. If you do not
wish to take from the cup, simply receive the bread and return to your seat.*

Note: *Intinction (dipping the bread into the chalice of wine) is not an option in the Anglican Church in
the Diocese of Toronto.*



What's happening:

- Almost every Sunday: 9:15 Children and Youth join together downstairs to talk about the day's Gospel passage, and catch up on their lives. We learn how to walk with Jesus not just on Sunday mornings, but all the time. Bring your big questions and prayers!
- Almost every Sunday 10:30 (NEW!) "Little Liturgy"-- children aged 4-12 join together in St Nick's chapel to hear an age-appropriate version of the gospel and pray together. They return to their parents in time for the Eucharist
- Every final Sunday of the month: "All-ins!" kids and parents go to church together! Look for opportunities for your child or youth to lead an aspect of worship.
- Every final Sunday of the month (NEW and with room to grow): "The Bridge" Youth aged 13-18 join our Children and Youth Coordinator for coffee at Tim Hortons or go on a walk together from 10am to 10:30.
- Every first Tuesday of the month: 6-7pm-- kids and youth join together for games, fellowship, and serving the community. The perfect opportunity to bring a friend to learn about church!



Truth and Reconciliation Working Group: As you walk around the city of Toronto, why not learn more about its Indigenous history? The Driftscape app (available on Apple and Android devices) displays landmarks near you and offers virtual tours – choose ‘Indigenous’ under My Interests – Categories, or search “First Story” to find tours or stories by the First Story project, developed by the Native Canadian Centre of Toronto to share local Indigenous history. You can also look at books such as Indigenous Toronto: Stories that Carry this Place, which shares different stories, histories, and perspectives by Indigenous writers.



Climate Action Group: Ecologist Dr Lenore Fahrig, a Carleton University prof who won the Gerhard Herzberg Canada Gold Medal, says that in a human dominated landscape a lot of the habitat for biodiversity is in little patches and "it can be hard to make an argument to save a small patch of forest or wetland." Her work shows "if you have a whole bunch of little patches, it can be just as valuable or even more valuable than having one large area of the same total size." 
