The Holy Gospel

They replied, "The things about Jesus of Nazareth, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, and how our chief priests and leaders handed him over to be condemned to death and crucified him. But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since these things took place. Moreover, some women of our group astounded us. They were at the tomb early this morning, and when they did not find his body there, they came back and told us that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who said that he was alive. Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said; but they did not see him." Then he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared! Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and then enter into his glory?" Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures. As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on. But they urged him strongly, saying, "Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over." So he went in to stay with them. When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?" That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together. They were saying, "The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!" Climate Action Group: Stop and marvel – it is spring! The daffodils are in bloom, the tulips rushing to join them, and birds singing merrily wake us at 5 a.m. Take a moment each day to notice your surroundings and something new that God has brought forth this season.



Truth and Reconciliation Working Group: On March 30, 2023, the Vatican repudiated the Doctrine of Discovery, a series of papal decrees (bulls), the first of which was issued in 1452. These decrees authorized colonial powers to seize lands and subjugate people who were not Christian on these lands, based on the belief that non-Christian peoples were inferior and could not 'discover' or own

land themselves. The Vatican stated that the Catholic Church repudiates those concepts that fail to recognize the inherent human rights of indigenous peoples, including what has become known as the legal and political 'doctrine of discovery'. The Church also stated that it strongly supports the U.N. Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples. Indigenous groups had previously called on the Catholic Church to issue a formal repudiation of the Doctrine. In July 2022, during his visit to Canada, Pope Francis personally apologized to Taylor Behn-Tsakoza, a youth delegate with the Assembly of First Nations, for the role of the Catholic Church in contributing to years of suffering. In Canada, the doctrine was repudiated by the Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples (RCAP), which was active from 1991 to 1996, and the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, which was active from 2008 to 2015. Both Commissions called on governments to remove the doctrine from Canadian laws and policies.
