Climate Action Group: Let's remember: nature lovers are in the majority – we have power. Together we can build an equitable, compassionate world for all people – and the millions of species with whom we share our home. [Source <u>rabble.ca</u> 21 April 2023]



Truth and Reconciliation Working Group: In Canada, between the 1950s and 1980s, more than 22,000 Indigenous children were removed from their birth parents by government child welfare agencies. Many parents and communities did not give consent, and communities were not even required to be notified that a child had been removed until 1980. The children were adopted by non-Indigenous families in Canada and the United States as well as in other countries, and many d



families in Canada and the United States, as well as in other countries, and many did not learn of their heritage until later in life. This practice is known as the *Sixties Scoop*.

In 2018, an \$875-million class action settlement awarded *Sixties Scoop* survivors \$25,000 each. To date, more than 21,000 individual settlement claims have been approved. However, Indigenous children are still significantly over-represented in child welfare: as of 2016, Indigenous children make up only 7.7% children in Canada but account for 52.2% of children in foster care.

In 2014, two *Sixties Scoop* survivors started the *Sixties Scoop* Network. Some of the settlement money was given to a healing foundation that is helping the *Sixties Scoop* Network fund an online mapping project for survivors that allows users to build profiles and share information about where they were born, where they were placed, and whether they wish to find or be contacted by their biological families. One hundred survivors have mapped themselves so far.
