- 7. TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP: Friday May 5th marked the National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls and Two-Spirit people (MMIWG), also known as Red Dress Day. Leading up to the day, the federal House of Commons unanimously voted to declare that the continued disappearance and murder of Indigenous women, girls, and Two-Spirit people is a national emergency. Indigenous women and girls are 12 times more likely to be missing or murdered than other women or girls in Canada. They are more likely to experience domestic violence but also more likely to be killed by acquaintances or strangers, and are also disproportionately likely to be targets of other kinds of violence. The same holds true for Two-Spirit and LGBTQ+ Indigenous people. The 2019 report from the

National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls listed many Calls for Justice, some of which apply to all Canadians and urge us to learn more about the crisis. The website of the National Inquiry has much more information: <u>https://www.mmiwg-ffada.ca/</u>

- **8. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP:** The peer reviewed journal *Science* noted the most climate damaging food studied is beef. Every kilogram consumed on average adds 99.5 kilograms of CO2 equivalent greenhouse gases to the environment, 2.5 worse for the environment than lamb, more than f4 times worse than cheese or 7 times worse than farmed fish, 8 times worse than pork, 10 times worse than poultry. Producing a kilogram of beef contributed over 22 times more to climate crisis than producing a kilogram of rice, 63 times more than a kilogram of wheat. Root veggies, certain tree fruits and nuts were all more than 200 times more climate-efficient by weight than beef. [Source: *Guardian*, Joe Fassler, 3 May 2023]
- **9. MEALS ON WHEELS**: Are you tired of preparing your meals each day? Are you a senior or a house-bound individual having difficulty shopping for food supplies? They have volunteers who can deliver hot meals or frozen entrees (chosen by you from an extensive menu) to your home at reasonable prices.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We acknowledge that the land on which we worship is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee (*ho-den-oh-shownee*), and Anishinabek (*ah-nish-nahbek*) Nations, and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. This territory is part of the *Dish with One Spoon Treaty*, an agreement between the Anishinabek, Haudenosaunee, and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes.

We are grateful for the resources we are using, and honour all the First Nations, Métis, and Inuit people who have been living on this land since time immemorial.
