Everything You Always Wanted to Know About 10:30 Coffee Hour: If you are interested in helping out at coffee time, but aren't sure about what it involves, please join Sandra Geddes on Sunday, May 14 and she will show you the ropes. Meet her in the Elliott Hall kitchen at 9:45am to learn the coffee preparation, and then come back to the kitchen right after Communion and you'll learn how to get everything set out, how to serve the coffee (and cookies and tea), and how to clean up afterwards. Remember, the more the merrier (and you get to sample the goodies before everyone else arrives!).

Climate Action Group: There's a grassroots campaign to put food systems at the forefront of combating the climate crisis. It aims to halt the widespread degradation of critical ecosystems

caused by animal agriculture and promote a shift to healthier, sustainable plant-based diets. It is urging scientists, individuals, groups, businesses and cities to endorse this call to action and put pressure on national governments to negotiate an international Plant Based Treaty.



Truth and Reconciliation Working Group: In Canada, between the 1950s and 1980s, more than 22,000 Indigenous children were removed from their birth parents by government child welfare agencies. Many parents and communities did not give consent, and communities were not even required to be notified that a child had been removed until 1980. The children were adopted by non-Indigenous




families in Canada and the United States, as well as in other countries, and many did not learn of their heritage until later in life. This practice is known as the *Sixties Scoop*.

In 2018, an \$875-million class action settlement awarded *Sixties Scoop* survivors \$25,000 each. To date, more than 21,000 individual settlement claims have been approved. However, Indigenous children are still significantly over-represented in child welfare: as of 2016, Indigenous children make up only 7.7% children in Canada but account for 52.2% of children in foster care.

In 2014, two *Sixties Scoop* survivors started the *Sixties Scoop* Network. Some of the settlement money was given to a healing foundation that is helping the *Sixties Scoop* Network fund an online mapping project for survivors that allows users to build profiles and share information about where they were born, where they were placed, and whether they wish to find or be contacted by their biological families. One hundred survivors have mapped themselves so far.
