- 1. A NOTE FROM PROUD ANGLICANS ABOUT MARCHING IN TODAY'S PARADE: Our marchers are asked to be on Bloor St between Church and Jarvis at 2:00pm on Sunday 25 June. That's right in front of St Paul's Bloor St. We are group C30, and will set off some time after 2:00. Anglicans should gather near the Proud Anglicans water tents on the steps of St Paul's. Traffic will be a mess the best bet is subway to Sherbourne station. We also need a few volunteers to staff the water tables this is a good way to participate if you don't want to be in the parade. Proud Anglicans will have a float in the parade -- a TTC electric bus. People of limited mobility can be in the parade by riding in the bus, from Church St just north of Bloor to Dundas and Church. - **2. EDITOR WANTED FOR** *SPIRITUS*: As announced at Vestry, after eight years of dedication as editor of our parish newsletter *Spiritus*, sadly, Genevieve Chornenki is putting down her red pen. We are currently looking for someone to take up this important ministry, with overall responsibility for producing the newsletter several times a year, working together with a small editorial team. *Spiritus* publishes opinion pieces, educational notes, book reviews, ministry and committee reports, notices, and other miscellaneous items, without demanding conformity of thought or opinion. All members of the parish are invited to write for it, and many are regular contributors. Typically, there are three regular issues each year published for Lent, Fall and

- **3. TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP:** On June 17, the governments of Canada and Ontario and a group of 21 Anishinaabe communities from the north shore of Lake Huron reached a major settlement relating to unpaid treaty annuities. The Robinson-Huron treaty, which these communities had signed in 1850, explicitly promised that in exchange for allowing resource development on their lands, the communities would receive annual payments linked to the revenues of that development. However, despite active mining, lumber, and fishing industries in the area, the last increase in annual payments took place in 1874 since then, it has stayed at only \$4 per person per year. The court case was initially launched in 2012 and in 2018 the Ontario Superior Court of Justice ruled that the Crown must increase annual payments. The government of Ontario originally intended to appeal to the Supreme Court but eventually agreed to negotiation. Details on how the final settlement of \$10 billion will be disbursed are still to be decided, but the money will go partly to community development projects and partly to individuals.
- **4. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP:** All of us are familiar with helium-filled balloons, the ubiquitous decor at many birthday parties. It may then be surprising to realize that helium is a non-renewable resource. Because it is lighter than air, once helium is released it rises high enough to escape Earth's atmosphere. In its liquid state helium is the coldest element on Earth and is important to many agencies such as NASA (for use in liquid fuel rockets) and fields such as medicine (it is used in MRIs). However, at the current rate of usage, it is expected that we will run out of helium (estimates range from 25 to 200 years). It is a reminder to all of us to be prudent and wise in our use of natural resources and, perhaps for birthday parties this summer, a motivation to find an alternative to helium-filled balloons.
