- **3. TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP:** *Indspire* is a national Indigenous registered charity that invests in the education of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis people. It is the largest funder of Indigenous education outside the federal government. With the support of its funding partners, *Indspire* disburses financial awards, delivers programs, and provides resources to First Nations, Inuit, and Métis students, educators, communities and other stakeholders. Programs include *Rivers to Success, Teach for Tomorrow, National Gathering for Indigenous Education*, and *Building Brighter Futures: Bursaries, Scholarships and Awards*. In 2022-23, *Indspire* awarded over \$27.5 million through 7,522 bursaries and scholarships to

Indigenous students. Indspire also hosts the *National Gathering for Indigenous Education* which this year will be held in Montreal in November. The *Gathering* will provide opportunities to learn strategies to engage students, to share best practices in the classroom, and to examine emerging trends affecting Indigenous students. Education disparities remain a serious issue in Canada: according to recent statistics, only 63% of all First Nations youth had completed high school, compared with 91% of the non-Indigenous population. 4. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP: The climate crisis has been brought home to people across Canada in 2023 through the dangerous and unprecedented wildfire season that has burnt almost twice as much area as the previous record year. Across the world, extreme heat, wildfires, flooding and extreme weather events have caused devastation to millions. For many in the global south, this was already a reality that continues to get worse, a crisis driven by the increasing concentration of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere from reliance on fossil fuel energy. More than 30 years of international talks have failed to stem the rise of carbon emissions: governments remain wedded to fossil fuels, subsidizing their operations, approving new oil and gas production and building pipelines and other infrastructure. The Ford government's expansion of gas-fired electricity plants in Ontario is a local example of public energy policy moving in the wrong direction. But the science is clear: we must stop producing and burning fossil fuels as quickly as possible to avoid the worst of the climate crisis - we are in it now.
