TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP: Saturday September 30th marks the third annual National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, also called Orange Shirt Day, which remembers the devastating legacy of residential schools. Many events will be taking place, including the Indigenous Legacy Gathering at Nathan Phillips Square (September 29-30). - 10. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP: When it comes to things like the Greenbelt, we must keep the future in mind. The area cleans the air, absorbs excess rainwater, and keeps development away from our watersheds; it provides local agricultural produce and provides wildlife habit; it offers recreational space such as hiking trails. All of these benefits become even more crucial to mitigate the effects of climate change, and they are benefits we are responsible for stewarding for future generations.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We acknowledge that the land on which we worship is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee (ho-den-oh-shownee), and Anishinabek (ah-nish-nahbek) Nations, and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit.
