- 8. TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP: Indspire is a national Indigenous registered charity that invests in the education of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis people. It is the largest funder of Indigenous education outside the federal government. With the support of its funding partners, Indspire disburses financial awards, delivers programs, and provides resources to First Nations, Inuit, and Métis students, educators, communities and other stakeholders. Programs include Rivers to Success, Teach for Tomorrow, National Gathering for Indigenous Education, and Building Brighter Futures: Bursaries, Scholarships and Awards. In 2022-23, Indspire awarded over \$27.5 million through 7,522 bursaries and scholarships to Indigenous students. Indspire also hosts the National Gathering for Indigenous Education which this year will be held in Montreal in November. The Gathering will provide opportunities to learn strategies to engage students, to share best practices in the classroom, and to examine emerging trends affecting Indigenous students. Education disparities remain a serious issue in Canada: according to recent statistics, only 63% of all First Nations youth had completed high school, compared with 91% of the non-Indigenous population. - **9. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP:** UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres asserts "The era of global warming has ended and the era of global boiling has arrived." - **10. COMMUNITY BREAKFAST VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!** We are looking for some more volunteer support for our Community Breakfast program, which runs three out of the four Saturdays a month from 7am-10am. - 11. SUPPORT FOR FLEMINGDON PARK MINISTRY'S URBAN FARM: Since 2018, the Common Table farm and market project of Flemingdon Park Ministry has provided fresh produce to people in the Flemingdon Park community, many of whom are newcomers to Canada. As its seed funding comes to an end, Common Table is looking for funding for 2024 and beyond. On Sept. 23 from 2-5 p.m., the farm will host a Harvest Fundraiser with farm tours, tasty treats, music and silent auction. Admission is free - sign at https://www.eventbrite.com/e/harvest-fundraiser-for-the-common-table-farm-tickets-704728119777. Also, during September, all donations up to \$75,000 will be matched by local corporate donor Lucullus Bakery.

REFUGEE SPONSORSHIP: Christ Church has partnered with a private sponsor group to help **12.** bring Farima and her children to Canada. Farima is an Afghan single mother whose husband was killed by the Taliban in 2021. She has two young children, a boy age 5 and a girl age 1. They are ethnic Hazara, a minority in Afghanistan which is persecuted by the Taliban and ISIS. Their application is pending, and while we don't have an exact arrival date, it appears likely to be within a few months. The family are currently in hiding in Pakistan. The sponsor group is looking for volunteers who would like to be part of the support group for the family. The kinds of activities we will do include finding household goods and clothing, assisting in opening bank accounts, applying for OHIP and other government benefits, accompanying the family to doctor and dentist appointments, setting up school for Farima's son and English language classes for her. Many of the activities will happen close to arrival. There is no fixed time commitment and we hope to have enough volunteers so that no one is asked to do too much.
