- **5. THANKSGIVING FOOD DRIVE:** Fall is right around the corner, and so we will be accepting items for our Thanksgiving food drive. Items of particular need are: cereals, rice, pasta, canned fruits, canned vegetables, canned meat, canned fish, legumes, peanut butter, and baby food. From the Sundays of September 10 through October 8, items can be placed in the red wagon at the back of the sanctuary; after being blessed on Thanksgiving Sunday, the items will be donated to the Churches-on-the-Hill Food Bank.
- 6. PONDERING THE PSALMS: The Psalms are full of joy, gratitude, lament, and anger. Come and learn more about these poems that we hear each week in church. - 7. TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP: The news this summer has been filled with fires, floods, and other disasters caused by climate change. As we reflect on how we can best care for our earth, it is important to remember the role of Indigenous communities. Across the world, Indigenous people steward about 20-25% of the land, but this land contains about 80% of the earth's biodiversity and 40% of what are called 'ecologically intact' landscapes. The COP 15 UN Biodiversity Conference last year emphasized the important role of Indigenous Peoples in protecting biodiversity; following the conference the Canadian government committed \$800 million to funding Indigenous-led conservation over the next seven years. Past reports have shown examples that Indigenous communities have been highly successful at conservation efforts on their lands for example, a UN report from 2021 noted that between 2006 and 2011, Indigenous lands in the Peruvian Amazon reduced deforestation twice as much as other similar protected areas.
- **8. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP:** The Dalai Lama once said, "Anyone who thinks that they are too small to make a difference has never tried to fall asleep with a mosquito in the room."
- 9. SUPPORT FOR FLEMINGDON PARK MINISTRY'S URBAN FARM: Since 2018, the Common Table farm and market project of Flemingdon Park Ministry has provided fresh produce to people in the Flemingdon Park community, many of whom are newcomers to Canada. As its seed funding comes to an end, Common Table is looking for funding for 2024 and beyond. On Sept. 23 from 2-5 p.m., the farm will host a Harvest Fundraiser with farm tours, tasty treats, music and a silent auction. Admission is free – sign up online at https://www.eventbrite.com/e/harvest-fundraiser-for-the-common-table-farm-tickets-

704728119777. Also, during September, all donations up to \$75,000 will be matched by local corporate donor Lucullus Bakery.

**10**. **REFUGEE SPONSORSHIP:** Christ Church has partnered with a private sponsor group to help bring Farima and her children to Canada. Farima is an Afghan single mother whose husband was killed by the Taliban in 2021. She has two young children, a boy age 5 and a girl age 1. They are ethnic Hazara, a minority in Afghanistan which is persecuted by the Taliban and ISIS. Their application is pending, and while we don't have an exact arrival date, it appears likely to be within a few months. The family are currently in hiding in Pakistan. The sponsor group is looking for volunteers who would like to be part of the support group for the family. The kinds of activities we will do include finding household goods and clothing, assisting in opening bank accounts, applying for OHIP and other government benefits, accompanying the family to doctor and dentist appointments, setting up school for Farima's son and English language classes for her. Social activities will also be important, including going on outings in Toronto so they can learn how to get around the city and shop and budget appropriately. Many of the activities will happen close to arrival. There is no fixed time commitment and we hope to have enough volunteers so that no one is asked to do too much. If you don't have time to help in person and would like to assist with a financial donation, that is also an option as they are still raising money to meet the goal for sponsorship. Linda, contact details above, can provide details of how to do that.

#### LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We acknowledge that the land on which we worship is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee (ho-den-oh-shownee), and Anishinabek (ah-nish-nahbek) Nations, and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. This territory is part of the Dishwith One Spoon Treaty, an agreement between the Anishinabek, Haudenosaunee, and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes.

Today, Toronto is still home to many Indigenous people from across Turtle Island (North America) and we seek to live in respect, peace, and right relations with them as we meet and worship on this territory. We are grateful for the resources we are using, and honour all the First Nations, Métis, and Inuit people who have been living on this land since time immemorial.
