- 2. COMMUNITY BREAKFAST VOLUNTEERS NEEDED! We are looking for some more volunteer support for our Community Breakfast program, which runs three out of the four Saturdays a month from 7am-10am. - **3. SEASON OF CREATION!** Please join us this year as we observe the Season of Creation with the following worship activities:
  - **a. Guest Preacher Dr. Sylvia Keesmaat** will join us on Sunday, September 24<sup>th</sup> at the 9:15am and 10:30am services. Sylvia, a biblical scholar, farmer, and activist, will preach on voices of the land.
  - **b.** Blessing of the Pets on the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi: We will gather on Wednesday, October 4<sup>th</sup> at 6pm on the west lawn to bless our pets and animals. All species are welcome, but please ensure your pet is on a leash or in a carrier (as we don't want any escapees!) This low-key service is a great one to invite friends and neighbours to.

- **4. THANKSGIVING FOOD DRIVE:** Fall is right around the corner, and so we will be accepting items for our Thanksgiving food drive. Items of particular need are: cereals, rice, pasta, canned fruits, canned vegetables, canned meat, canned fish, legumes, peanut butter, and baby food. From the Sundays of September 10 through October 8, items can be placed in the red wagon at the back of the sanctuary; after being blessed on Thanksgiving Sunday, the items will be donated to the Churches-on-the-Hill Food Bank.
- 5. TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP: Indspire is a national Indigenous registered charity that invests in the education of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis people. It is the largest funder of Indigenous education outside the federal government. With the support of its funding partners, Indspire disburses financial awards, delivers programs, and provides resources to First Nations, Inuit, and Métis students, educators, communities and other stakeholders. Programs include Rivers to Success, Teach for Tomorrow, National Gathering for Indigenous Education, and Building Brighter Futures: Bursaries, Scholarships and Awards. In 2022-23, Indspire awarded over \$27.5 million through 7,522 bursaries and scholarships to Indigenous students. Indspire also hosts the National Gathering for Indigenous Education which this year will be held in Montreal in November. The Gathering will provide opportunities to learn strategies to engage students, to share best practices in the classroom, and to examine emerging trends affecting Indigenous students. Education disparities remain a serious issue in Canada: according to recent statistics, only 63% of all First Nations youth had completed high school, compared with 91% of the non-Indigenous population. - **6. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP:** UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres asserts "The era of global warming has ended and the era of global boiling has arrived." July was the hottest month ever, "Humanity is in the hot seat. For vast parts of North America, Asia, Africa, and Europe, it is a cruel summer. For the entire planet, it is a disaster. - 7. SUPPORT FOR FLEMINGDON PARK MINISTRY'S URBAN FARM: Since 2018, the Common Table farm and market project of Flemingdon Park Ministry has provided fresh produce to people in the Flemingdon Park community, many of whom are newcomers to Canada. As its seed funding comes to an end, Common Table is looking for funding for 2024 and beyond. On Sept. 23 from 2-5 p.m., the farm will host a Harvest Fundraiser with farm tours, tasty treats, music and silent auction. Also, during September, all donations up to \$75,000 will be matched by local corporate donor Lucullus Bakery.

#### LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We acknowledge that the land on which we worship is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee (ho-den-oh-shownee), and Anishinabek (ah-nish-nahbek) Nations, and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. This territory is part of the Dishwith One Spoon Treaty, an agreement between the Anishinabek, Haudenosaunee, and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes.

Today, Toronto is still home to many Indigenous people from across Turtle Island (North America) and we seek to live in respect, peace, and right relations with them as we meet and worship on this territory.
