- 11. TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP: Neskantaga First Nation is a remote Oji-Cree First Nation in the northern reaches of Ontario, situated along the shore of Attawapiskat Lake in the District of Kenora. It is about 450 kilometers north of Thunder Bay. The water source for this community is Attawapiskat Lake. The water has to be filtered before it can be used as drinking water because of the roots of trees, plants, and other organic matter in the water. A Drinking Water Advisory (DWA) was put in place in 1995, after the natural sand, lowfilter water treatment plant paid for by the federal Indian Affairs department in 1993 proved to be improperly built. This DWA is still in effect and is the longest in Canada. It affects 76 households and 6 community buildings. Canadian news organizations began to cover the story of unsafe water supply in 2004. A plan by the Canadian government in 2005 to modernize water supplies was cancelled, following a change of government in 2006. In 2016, the federal government announced it would invest approximately \$8.8 million to help upgrade the community's water treatment system. By March 2021, the upgrade and completion of the water treatment plant was nearing completion. However, some deficiencies remain, including performance testing to confirm that the system will meet the 20-year water needs of the community. Until that is completed, the DWA will remain.
- **12. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP:** In October 2021, the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) recognized for the first time "that having a clean, healthy, and sustainable environment is a human right." ...wildfires continue to pose a direct threat to bio-diversity across the planet. According to the Living Planet Report 2020 by the World Wildlife Fund

(WWF), populations of monitored mammals, fish, birds, reptiles, and amphibians have collectively dwindled by nearly 70 percent worldwide from 1970 to 2016. The underlying cause: humanity. [Source: the Bullet, Reynard Loki, "Wildfires and the Threat to Earth's Biodiversity, " 6 Sept. 2023]

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We acknowledge that the land on which we worship is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee (*ho-den-oh-shownee*), and Anishinabek (*ah-nish-nahbek*) Nations, and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. This territory is part of the *Dish with One Spoon Treaty*, an agreement between the Anishinabek, Haudenosaunee, and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes.

Today, Toronto is still home to many Indigenous people from across Turtle Island (North America) and we seek to live in respect, peace, and right relations with them as we meet and worship on this territory. We are grateful for the resources we are using, and honour all the First Nations, Métis, and Inuit people who have been living on this land since time immemorial.
