A Bidding Prayer for Advent

Presider:

Beloved in Christ, as we enter the season of Advent and await the great festival of Christmas, let us gather this day to proclaim and receive in our hearts the good news of the coming of God's Kingdom; and so prepare ourselves to celebrate with confidence, the joy of our Saviour's birth. Let us hear, in lessons from Holy Scripture, how the prophets of Israel foretold that God would visit and redeem his waiting people. Let us rejoice in our carols and hymns that the good purpose of God is being mightily fulfilled. Let us celebrate the promise that our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, will bring his people and all things into the glory of God's eternal Kingdom; where the blind receive their sight, and the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, and the Gospel is proclaimed.

But first, let us pray for the world which God so loves, especially for those in need of his care and protection: the sick in body, mind or spirit; those who suffer from loss of dignity or loss of hope; those who live with war and violence; those who face the future with fear, or walk in the shadow of death. And we pray for the Church in this place and everywhere, that it may be freed from all evil and fear, and may in pure joy lift up the light of the love of God, giving thanks for Christ's kingdom; its works of justice and its promise of peace, its blessing and its hope. These prayers and praises let us humbly offer to God, in the words which Christ himself taught us:

Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

First Lesson *Our fall from grace*

Read by Nigel Johnson

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the Lord God had made. He said to the woman, 'Did God say, "You shall not eat from any tree in the garden"?' The woman said to the serpent, 'We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; but God said, "You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden, nor shall you touch it, or you

shall die." But the serpent said to the woman, 'You will not die; for God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.' So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate. Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves. They heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden. But the Lord God called to the man, and said to him, 'Where are you?' He said, 'I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself.' He said, 'Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?' The man said, 'The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit from the tree, and I ate.' Then the Lord God said to the woman, 'What is this that you have done?' The woman said, 'The serpent tricked me, and I ate.' The Lord God said to the serpent, 'Because you have done this, cursed are you among all animals and among all wild creatures; upon your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life. I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike your head, and you will strike his heel. 'To the woman he said, 'I will greatly increase your pangs in childbearing; in pain you shall bring forth children, yet your desire shall be for your husband.' And to the man he said, 'Because you have eaten of the tree about which I commanded you, "You shall not eat of it, cursed is the ground because of you; in toil you shall eat of it all the days of your life; thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you; and you shall eat the plants of the field. By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread until you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; you are dust, and to dust you shall return. 'The man named his wife Eve, because she was the mother of all who live. And the Lord God made garments of skins for the man and for his wife, and clothed them. Then the Lord God said, 'See, the man has become like one of us, knowing good and evil; and now, he might reach out his hand and take also from the tree of life, and eat, and live for ever.' Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Food production is the biggest cause of tropical deforestation tips to reduce waste include planning ahead, being realistic about how much food you need, using leftovers, and having re-usable containers on hand for food storage. Additionally, poultry is in the top 10 most wasted foods; the livestock industry as a whole generates 14.5% of all human-made greenhouse gas emissions and requires huge amounts of space, water, and feed.
