THANK YOU to guest preacher Dr. Sylvia Keesmaat for being with us this morning on this First Sunday in Advent. Sylvia is a biblical scholar, activist, and farmer. She obtained her doctorate at Oxford University, studying with N.T. Wright, and has most recently taught as the Adjunct Professor of Biblical Studies at Trinity College, Toronto School of Theology, as well as for the Creation Care Studies Program in Belize.

Sylvia is the co-author, with Brian Walsh, of *Romans Disarmed: Resisting Empire, Demanding Justice* (Brazos Press, 2019) and *Colossians Remixed: Subverting the Empire* (IVP, 2004).

Sylvia is the co-chair of the Bishop's Committee on Creation Care for the Anglican Diocese of Toronto. She speaks frequently on topics related to the Bible and economic justice, climate catastrophe, gender justice, and Indigenous justice. In 2021, Sylvia founded *Bible Remixed* (www.bibleremixed.ca) to help nurture a community of Jesus followers who are deeply rooted in the biblical story, and who are becoming a community of welcome, healing, and nurture for those people and creatures who suffer most from the violence of our world.

Every spring, Sylvia holds an heirloom tomato seedling sale. She also speaks to horticultural societies and other groups about permaculture, forest gardening, and pollinator insects.

Sylvia lives at Russet House Farm, and off-grid permaculture fam in the Kawartha Lakes on the traditional territory of the Michi Saagiig Nishnaabeg, with her husband, Brian Walsh, and a fluctuating number of people and animals.

- **6. TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP:** On October 24, 2023 the Federal Court approved a \$23 billion settlement agreement for First Nations children and families affected by inequitable funding for on-reserve child and family services. After a complaint was first filed in 2007, the Canadian Human Rights Tribunal ruled in 2019 that the federal government was denying on-reserve First Nations children the same level of care as other children. Among other issues, such as not accounting for inflation, the CHRT noted that the funding structure meant agencies could not properly support prevention or try to keep children with their

families if possible. According to recent Canadian data, 53.8% of children in foster care are Indigenous, even though they represent only 7.7% of the total children in Canada.

7. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP: Should I get an artificial or real Christmas tree: which is better for the environment? There are pros and cons to each. With real trees, Christmas tree farms can displace natural ecosystems; with artificial trees, their manufacture depletes natural resources and generates greenhouse gas emissions. For best practices; if you get a real tree, buy one locally grown – don't drive too far to get it; if you get an artificial tree, try to make it last – studies have shown you can minimize your carbon impact by keeping the same tree for at least 8 years, but ideally more than 20. When disposing of your real tree, try to ensure it will be turned into mulch rather than dumped in a landfill; when you're ready to part with your artificial tree, consider donating it to another family. Studies have shown the environmental impact of buying a Christmas tree is minimal compared to flying or driving a few hours to see family and friends for the holidays.
