- 1. PASTORAL CALLS:** From time to time, depending upon what is happening in our lives, we could benefit from a call or visit from one of our clergy. If you or anyone you know might be in need, please contact our congregational care team: communitycare@christchurchdeerpark.org
- 2. SATURDAY COMMUNITY BREAKFAST** is in need of winter socks, sweaters, hoodies, winter coats, shoes, boots, slippers, gloves, hats, scarves for our guests. We are also looking for toiletries (soap, body wash, lip care, lotion, shampoo). Please leave in the bins at the Bell tower door or Yonge street door. Our guests are very appreciative – thank you!
- 3. CHURCHES ON THE HILL FOOD BANK:** In the last year we have provided over 100,000 meals to our 720 families. In 2020 we were serving over 200 families a week and are now serving over 400 families. We will spend \$300,000 on food this year. Approx 40% of our food is provided by Daily Bread and 10% from the affiliated churches and community. - 4. TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP:** Looking to support Indigenous artists and makers as you shop for Christmas presents? Toronto has a number of shops featuring authentic Indigenous art, home goods, and other gifts. Some options include: Pacha Indigenous Art Collection (789 Dundas St. W), the Native Canadian Centre of Toronto's Cedar Basket Gift Shop (16 Spadina Rd.), and Mino Bimaadiziwin Indigenous Art Market (1107 Queen St. E).
- 5. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP:** Environmental justice is not a category unto itself. Justice for the environment goes hand-in-hand with economic justice. We cannot seek one without the other, for it is always those who have fewer resources and less wealth, those who are already under-represented or marginalized due to race or gender, that bear the brunt of calamities and injustice. It is the fisherman off the coast of India who cannot feed his family due to foreign trawlers harvesting most of the fish; it is the Congolese teenager who toils in the toxic cobalt mines, never earning more than a scrap in a billion-dollar industry; it is the elder living in Grassy Narrows who has difficulty standing and swallowing due to mercury poisoning, the result of a paper mill's pollution of the watershed sixty years ago. This Advent, let us pay attention to Mary's words of praise: "He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty." (Luke 1: 52-53) Let us, too, lift up the lowly and fill the hungry with good things; let us protect the environments and ecosystems our neighbours on Earth rely upon for life itself.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We acknowledge that the land on which we worship is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee (*ho-den-oh-show-nee*), and Anishinabek (*ah-nish-nah-bek*) Nations, and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. This territory is part of the *Dish with One Spoon Treaty*, an agreement between the Anishinabek, Haudenosaunee, and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes.

Today, Toronto is still home to many Indigenous people from across Turtle Island (*North America*) and we seek to live in respect, peace, and right relations with them as we meet and worship on this territory.
