

- **7. TRUTH & RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP:** In late 2022, National Ribbon Skirt Day was recognized by an act of Parliament and is now held on January 4th each year. The day was created to spread awareness of and normalize Indigenous clothing, after 10-year-old Isabella Kulak was shamed for wearing a ribbon skirt to a formal day at her Saskatchewan school in 2021. Ribbon skirts are traditionally worn by First Nations and Métis people and are a centuries-old symbol of identity, adaptation, and survival for Indigenous women, girls, and gender-diverse people. In 1884, the Indian Act was amended by the Potlatch Ban, which banned several ceremonial items and practices including ribbon skirts. This ban was ended in 1951, when the Indian Act was substantially revised.
- **8. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP:** Line 5 is a 70-year-old crude oil pipeline that sits at the bottom of the Straits of Mackinac between Lake Michigan and Lake Huron. Having leaked 33 times (spilling upwards of 4.5 million litres of oil) since 1953, it is at-risk of contaminating up to 1200 km of shoreline, including places like Manitoulin Island, Sauble Beach, and Tobermory. A significant rupture would impact drinking water, wildlife habitat, and the neighbouring Indigenous peoples, for whom the Great Lakes are spiritually significant. othering on our Church. Saturday, February 3, 2024 at St. James Cathedral Centre, Snell Hall (65 Church Street); doors open at 2:30pm, film begins at 3pm. The run time is 90 minutes, followed by a Q&A session with the Primate of the Anglican Church of Canada, Archbishop Linda Nicholls. Light refreshments will also be served. This territory is part of the Dish with One Spoon Treaty, an agreement between the Anishinabek, Haudenosaunee, and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes.

Today, Toronto is still home to many Indigenous people from across Turtle Island (North America) and we seek to live in respect, peace, and right relations with them as we meet and worship on this territory. We are grateful for the resources we are using, and honour all the First Nations, Métis, and Inuit people who have been living on this land since time immemorial.
