- **2. PASTORAL CALLS:** An integral part of Christian community is to support one another through times of joy and celebration and also times of grief and confusion. - **3. RUMMAGE SALE INTAKE!** Our next Rummage Sale is approaching (April 20!), and we have cleaned our space in preparation for our Spring Clothing and Accessories Sale intake collection. For many newcomers and young neighbourhood dwellers, our sale is a great resource when creating their new homes. We plan to include GENTLY used household linens at all of our sales. Please check your closets, and think of us as you purge. Drop off clothes and linens to the Atrium (the glass doors halfway down the building on Heath Street) between 11 and 2pm on the Saturdays of February 3, 10, 17 and 24th, as well as March 16 and 23rd. We are always looking for fellow workers, if you care to join us pre sale, or on our sale day. We laugh, we work, and we make money for the Church along the way. - 4. TRUTH & RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP: On December 11, 2023, the twelve members of the Indigenous Advisory Council of the Canadian National Railway (CN) resigned effective December 31. The Co-Chairs of the Council, Senator Murray Sinclair and Roberta Jamieson, explained that the CN had not acknowledged the role the railway had played in the land dispossession and starvation of Indigenous people whose land was taken to build the railway. The Advisory Committee was formed in 2021 by the CN and intended to be independent and composed of Indigenous Leaders with representatives from First Nations, Inuit and Métis people from each province and territory. The Council prepared a report for the CN with recommendations that the company acknowledge the past harms to Indigenous people and implement an apology framework. As railways were being built across Canada, Indigenous people were often either displaced or forced to accept the disruption of trains running through reserve land. For instance, to make room for the Canadian Pacific Railway in the 1880s, almost 5,000 First Nations people were forcibly removed from the Cypress Hills in Saskatchewan by withholding their food rations. CN has now put together a team of nine

managers, including Indigenous and regional representatives, to develop a reconciliation action plan.

- 5. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP: Highway 413 is a proposed highway that would span from the 400 to the 427. Environmental groups have raised concerns over this provincial proposal. For one, it would pave over 2400 acres of combined Greenbelt area and farmland, impacting southern Ontario's ability to feed its population and provide natural places for wildlife (including at-risk and endangered species) and human recreation. Also, it would encourage further urban sprawl, an inefficient use of land that creates expensive, single-family, car-dependent homes in communities that are not walkable and which have little to no access to public transit or local amenities. Groups suggest alternatives to a new highway, including a regional rail express line, new GO train corridor, and increased rapid bus and light rail transit in busy GTA municipalities [Environmental Defence Canada, https://environmentaldefence.ca/]

- **8. THE PHILADELPHIA ELEVEN SCREENING:** All are welcome to attend a free screening of the film *The Philadelphia Eleven*, which is the story of the first 11 women seeking ordination in the Episcopal Church in 1974, and also touches on the broader topic of all forms of exclusion and othering on our Church. Saturday, February 3, 2024 at St. James Cathedral Centre, Snell Hall (65 Church Street); doors open at 2:30pm, film begins at 3pm. The run time is 90 minutes, followed by a Q&A session with the Primate of the Anglican Church of Canada, Archbishop Linda Nicholls. Light refreshments will also be served. - **9. MEALS ON WHEELS:** Are you tired of preparing your meals each day? Are you a senior or a housebound individual having difficulty shopping for food? If so, call Yorkminster Park Meals on Wheels at 416-482-0549. We have volunteers who can deliver hot meals or frozen meals (chosen by you from an extensive menu) to your home at reasonable prices.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We acknowledge that the land on which we worship is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee (ho-den-oh-show-nee), and Anishinabek (ah-nish-nah-bek) Nations, and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. This territory is part of the Dish with One Spoon Treaty, an agreement between the Anishinabek, Haudenosaunee, and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes.

Today, Toronto is still home to many Indigenous people from across Turtle Island (North America) and we seek to live in respect, peace, and right relations with them as we meet and worship on this territory. We are grateful for the resources we are using, and honour all the First Nations, Métis, and Inuit people who have been living on this land since time immemorial.
