

The Great Litany is traditionally sung on the First Sunday in Lent, as way of setting the season of Lent within the context of prayer.

Cantor: God the Father, creator of heaven and earth,

Cantor:God the Son, redeemer of the world,All:Have mercy on us.

Cantor: God the Holy Spirit, advocate and guide, All: Have mercy on us.

Cantor: Holy, blessed, and glorious Trinity, three persons and one God,

All: Have mercy on us.

Cantor: Lord, remember not our offences, nor the offences of our forebears; spare us, good Lord, spare your people whom you have redeemed with your precious blood,

Cantor: From all evil and mischief; from sin, from the crafts and assaults of the devil; from your wrath, and from everlasting condemnation,

Cantor: From all spiritual blindness, from pride, vainglory, and hypocrisy; from envy, hatred, and malice; and from all want of charity,

All: Good Lord, deliver us.

Cantor: From all deadly sin, and from all the deceits of the world, the flesh, and the devil, **All: Good Lord, deliver us.**

Cantor: From all false doctrine, heresy, and schism; from hardness of heart, and contempt of your word and commandment,

All: Good Lord, deliver us.

Cantor: From earthquake and tempest; from drought, fire, and flood; from civil strife and violence; from war and murder; and from dying suddenly and unprepared,

All: Good Lord, deliver us.

Cantor: By the mystery of your holy incarnation; by your baptism, fasting and temptation; and by your proclamation of the kingdom,

All: Good Lord, deliver us.

Cantor: By your agony and bitter grief; by your cross and passion, by your precious death and burial, by your glorious resurrection and ascension, and by the coming of the Holy Spirit,

All: Good Lord, deliver us.

- Cantor: In our times of trouble, in our times of prosperity; in the hour of death, and on the day of judgment,
- All: Good Lord, deliver us.

Cantor: Receive now our prayers, Lord God. May it please you to rule and govern your holy Church universal and lead it in your way.



- 8. TRUTH & RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP: Jordan's Principle is a principle that was established in Canada to ensure that First Nations children receive medical, social, and educational care when they need it, instead of waiting because of jurisdictional disputes between levels of government. It was first established by First Nations in response to the death of five-year-old Jordan River Anderson, a child from Norway House Cree Nation who suffered from a rare muscular disorder that required years of medical treatment in a Winnipeg hospital. After spending the first two years of his life in a hospital, doctors cleared Jordan to live in a family home near the hospital. However, for over two years, the federal and provincial governments could not resolve who was responsible for paying for the necessary home care. Jordan died in 2005 in hospital and never had the opportunity to live in a family home. In June 2015, the Truth and Reconciliation Commission made Jordan's Principle the third of its 94 Calls to Action, calling on all levels of government to fully implement it. However, since then the government of Canada has been censured by the Canadian Human Rights Tribunal multiple times over failure to fully adhere to Jordan's Principle. In June 2019, the Calls for Justice of the National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls called for the federal and provincial/territorial governments to immediately implement Jordan's Principle for all First Nations (Status and non-Status) children.
- **9. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP:** At a news conference last week, Timmins MP Angus connected the dots from Bill C-372 to the 1990s tobacco advertising bans, arguing that today's fossil industry has shifted its "propaganda" by claiming its products are clean and part of the solution to climate change. "That's like Benson and Hedges telling you they can help end lung cancer," he said. "This is because Big Oil has always relied on the Big Tobacco playbook of delay and disinformation." [source: Energy Mix 11 Feb. 2024]
