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

(please kneel as your are able)

Leader: Lord Jesus Christ, the Spirit of the Lord was upon you, because he anointed you to preach good news to the poor. He sent you to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who were oppressed.



Leader: Lord Jesus Christ, you ate and drank with sinners. For those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. You did not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance.

Cantor: Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God,

All: have mercy on me, a sinner.

Leader: Lord Jesus Christ, you said to scribes and Pharisees who brought you to a woman caught in adultery, "Let him who is without sin be the first to throw a stone." 

All: we remember his death, we proclaim his resurrection, we await his coming in glory;


Presider: and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

- If you prefer to take only the bread, you may indicate this to the cup bearer by crossing your arms over your chest, or simply walking past them.



- **6. POLLINATOR GARDEN:** Those attending the Rev. Cathy Gibbs' Lenten study series at CCDP this past Tuesday evening heard about the benefits of planting native plants in the new pollinator garden. Brad Lennon of the property committee showed how the garden along the west boundary of the church property might be designed. We also heard from Donna Lang of the Greening Sacred Spaces project of the interfaith organization Faith and the Common Good. She has arranged for the grant from the TD Friends of the Environment Foundation that has enabled CCDP to purchase 70 plants that will be delivered to us in May. Donna also announced that she had received confirmation just that day that Scotts Canada would also be donating pallets of mulch and soil to us for the pollinator garden. That shipment will arrive in mid-April, and we will need a group of volunteers to spread the soil and mulch in the new garden. Brad Lennon has tentatively set the date of April 20th for that work party, so please let him know if you can help with that work. - **8. PASTORAL CALLS:** An integral part of Christian community is to support one another through times of joy and celebration and also times of grief and confusion. - **9. TRUTH & RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP:** In Canada, half of all incarcerated women are Indigenous even though Indigenous people make up about 5% of the total Canadian population. In maximum security, that number goes up to almost three-quarters. In November 2023, Ivan Zinger, the Correctional Investigator of Canada, released a report calling the situation unconscionable and noting that change has been very slow. Indigenous-led healing lodges are one recommended approach to better support incarcerated Indigenous people, but healing lodges run by communities are given significantly fewer resources than those run by the government, and there are only three healing lodges for women in Canada, all located in the prairies. Among other recommendations, the report urges Corrections Services to transfer control of healing lodges to local Indigenous communities and appropriately fund them.
- **10. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP:** With the climate crisis heat waves, droughts, storms, and flooding posing significant threats to systems aimed to prevent nuclear accidents time is precious. Governments must not waste time with nuclear energy fairy tales. Let's demand a just transition towards a safe, renewable energy system that secures jobs and protects life on our planet. [The International Atomic Energy Agency will hold a nuclear energy summit in Belgium on 21 March 2024].
