I am Stephen Drakeford (he/him) and I am pleased to be appointed your Interim-Priest-in-Charge. My appointment is until February 2025 or until a new incumbent is found!

As your Interim my goal is threefold: to give thanks but let go of Canon Palmer's wonderful ministry, live joyfully in this 'in-between time,' and prepare you for a successful next incumbency. Are you up for the challenge?!

- **9. TRUTH & RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP:** May 5th is Red Dress Day, also known as the National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls and Two-Spirit People. The goal of the day is to honour and bring awareness to the thousands of Indigenous women, girls, and Two-Spirit people who have gone missing or who have been murdered in Canada. Indigenous women and girls are disproportionately exposed to gender-based violence; according to Statistics Canada data from 2022, almost 3 out of 5 (56%)

Indigenous women have experienced physical assault while almost half (46%) of Indigenous women have experienced sexual assault. In comparison, about a third of non-Indigenous women have experienced physical assault or sexual assault.

- 10. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP: Earth's thermostat is broken, and scientists don't know why. Ocean temperatures from Mexico to Australia are at a level that was not expected for another 20 years; the Atlantic currents, which play a large role in regulating our climate, are disordered, and this is causing harm and species extinction. On land, millions of people are affected by worsening floods and wildfires. The crisis of our climate is one that will affect everyone on Earth for the rest of our lives and into the lives and futures of our children and grandchildren.
