All: Thanks be to God.


All are welcome to receive communion with us

- **9. TRUTH & RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP:** As previously mentioned, Indigenous Anglicans began the process of developing a self-determining church in 1994. This process continues to the present. In 2017, "The Road to Warm Springs," a National Consultation on Indigenous Anglican Self-Determination, was held in Pinawa, Manitoba. At the most recent Sacred Circle in 2023, those gathered ratified "The Covenant and Our Way of Life," documents similar to a constitution and canons that will structure a self-determining Indigenous Church as it develops. As of this year's General Synod in June, the Anglican Council of Indigenous Peoples has expanded the Our Way of Life document and is beginning the work of determining policies and structures that will support the statements laid out in the document. The Covenant and Our Way of life can be read online on the Anglican Church of Canada's website: https://www.anglican.ca/wp-content/uploads/SC-covenant-owol single.pdf
- 10. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP: Due to the unique histories of Indigenous Peoples' interactions with the United States and Canada, Tribal Nations and First Nations have a wide range of reserved rights that have been recognized and upheld within the eyes of nation-state court systems. These legal battles, coupled with grassroots expressions of self-determination, have stopped and delayed the expansion of fossil fuels, and also exposed the financial liabilities of such expansion when Indigenous Rights are violated... Indigenous campaigns are resisting projects equal to at least 1/4 of U.S. & Canadian greenhouse gas pollution... "Indigenous Resistance Against Carbon", Indigenous Environment Action, August 2021.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We acknowledge that the land on which we worship is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee (ho-den-oh-show-nee), and Anishinabek (ah-nish-nah-bek) Nations, and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. This territory is part of the Dish with One Spoon Treaty, an agreement between the Anishinabek, Haudenosaunee, and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes.
