Listening to God – First Reading

Reader: A reading from the Second Book of Samuel.


All are welcome to receive communion with us

- 12. TRUTH & RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP: Tk'emlúps te Secwépemc First Nation, the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Vancouver, and the Roman Catholic Diocese of Kamloops signed a Sacred Covenant on Easter Sunday describing how they will work together towards reconciliation. The discovery of 215 possible unmarked graves on the grounds of the Kamloops Indian Residential School (which was run by Catholic organizations) made news around the world in 2021; in the Covenant, the two Catholic dioceses commit to providing expertise and resources to support ongoing investigation of these possible graves, as well as counselling for those who lost loved ones at the school. In addition to other commitments, the Covenant also acknowledges that the residential school system did 'great harm' to Indigenous communities and that the separation of children from their families violated Catholic teachings.
- 13. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP: The burning of fossil fuels is responsible for 7,100 early deaths each year in Canada. By reducing our use of fossil fuels such as coal, oil, gasoline, diesel and natural gas, we can save lives, reduce chronic diseases, and cut healthcare costs, while fighting climate change. Chronic diseases cost about \$200 billion per year in treatment and lost-time in Canada. By investing in public transit, cycling and walking, which increase physical activity, we can save lives, reduce chronic diseases and healthcare costs, while fighting climate change.
