



And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may live in their own place, and be disturbed no more; and evildoers shall afflict them no more, as formerly, from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel; and I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover the Lord declares to you that the Lord will make you a house. When your days are fulfilled and you lie down with your ancestors, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come forth from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. He shall build a house for my name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. I will be a father to him, and he shall be a son to me.



Listening to God – Second Reading

Reader: A Reading from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians.

Remember that at one time you Gentiles by birth, called "the uncircumcision" by those who are called "the circumcision" - a physical circumcision made in the flesh by human hands - remember that you were at that time without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us. He has abolished the law with its commandments and ordinances, that he might create in himself one new humanity in place of the two, thus making peace, and might reconcile both groups to God in one body through the cross, thus putting to death that hostility through it. So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God. Ephesians 2:11-22







All:	Thanks be to God.


All are welcome to receive communion with us

1. CCDP STEWARDSHIP – A NOTE FROM THE WARDENS ON DECLINING CONGREGATIONAL GIVINGS:

As we settle into our summer routines and breaks, the wardens wanted to send a quick note to you all about the state of our CCDP finances, and especially a worrying trend of declining congregational givings.

This is a community that gives much in terms of its 'talents and time' and we are very grateful for the many contributions that you all make to the life of CCDP. We have a vibrant community here, and one that is also slowing beginning to grow again.

But, the one worrying trend amidst all this is the slow but steady decline in congregational givings, a decline that is contributing to a slow but growing church deficit, despite increases this year in revenue from such things as facilities rental.

To address this worrying trend, the warden team will be formulating and launching a stewardship campaign this fall.

But, these needs are also immediate. Hence, in the meantime time, we would ask you all to consider increasing your weekly/monthly givings to CCDP, knowing that, cumulatively, even small increases in givings from the many can have a transformative, positive impact on the whole.

To put it another way, please consider giving an increased share of your 'treasure' to CCDP, in addition to the already considerable contributions you are all making with respect to 'your talents and your time'.

- **12. TRUTH & RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP:** 2024 marks thirty years since a group of Indigenous Anglicans first developed a Covenant committing to create a self-determining Indigenous community within the Anglican Church of Canada. This Covenant followed from Primate Michael Peers' 1993 apology offered on behalf of the Anglican Church for its role in residential schools, in which he committed the national church to walk with and support Indigenous people in their healing journey. In 1997 the Covenant was ratified by a larger group of Indigenous and non-Indigenous Anglicans at the third Sacred Circle, a special meeting of Indigenous Anglicans where prayer, worship, discernment, and decision-making take place.
- **13. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP:** Eco-grief is our pain for the loss of our shared home stemming from a place of connectedness and love. It refers to sensations of fear, anxiety, anger, and sorrow linked to our intertwined ecological and social crises, emotions related to climate chaos and its devastating impacts on people and places and all living beings, on our planet as home. Anti-nuclear activist Joanna Macy writes, 'Pain is the price of consciousness in a threatened and suffering world. It is not only natural; it is an absolutely necessary component of our collective healing.'
