

Listening to God - Second Reading

Reader: A Reading from the Second Letter to the Corinthians.

I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven - whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. And I know that such a person - whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults,

hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong. *2 Corinthians 12:2-10*

Presider: The gifts of God, for the people of God.



- 12. TRUTH & RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP: A new Canadian law requires the federal government to develop a national strategy on environmental racism within the next two years. Environmental racism refers to discrimination in which racialized communities are more likely to be exposed to hazardous environments, such as landfills or pollution-heavy factories. The mercury contamination in Grassy Narrows First Nation is one example of what many consider environmental racism; a 2020 report by the UN Special Rapporteur on human rights and hazardous substances and wastes described Grassy Narrows' experience as "a clear case of discrimination and a gross violation of their human rights" by the federal and provincial governments.
- **13. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP:** A child born today will experience a world more than four degrees warmer than the pre-industrial average, with climate change impacting human health from infancy and adolescence to adulthood and old age.* The alternate path which limits the global average temperature rise to "well below 2°C" would transform the health of a child born today for the better, all the way through its life. *The 2019 report of The Lancet Countdown on health and climate change (Lancet 2019; 394: 1836-78 at 1836)
