




In fulfilment of your will he stretched out his hands in suffering, to bring release to those who place their hope in you; and so he won for you a holy people.



- 1. UPDATED FROM THE PARISH SELECTION COMMMITTEE: Christ Church's Parish Selection Committee is pleased to bring you the following updates. In addition, advertisements will be posted in the US and UK at the beginning of September in the *Living Church* and *Church Times* magazines. Applications are received by Bishop Andrew. In the meantime, we wait and pray!

- 5. DO YOU LOVE TO SING? IF SO, CONSIDER JOINING CHRIST CHURCH DEER PARK'S CHOIR! The volunteer choir meets for weekly rehearsal from September to June on Thursday evenings from 7pm-9pm, and at 9:45am on Sunday mornings in preparation for singing at the 10:30am service and other special events. - **6. READING THE BIBLE:** As we have not had enough registrations, this series will be postponed until further notice.
- 7. A SPIRITUAL PATH; WORSHIP OUT ON TORONTO'S TRAILS WITH THE CCDP WALKING GROUP: Brad Lennon and Rev. Stephen will be offering an urban hike on Saturday, September 14th at 11 AM. (Dogs are welcome!) Meet at the church, and we will go from there through David Balfour Park and the Park Drive Reservation to the Brickworks. This is an easy hike with a few gentle hills over a mix of paved and gravel trails through a forest ecosystem and the city's ravines. You'll



be alongside Yellow Creek for part of the hike, surrounded by maple and oak trees. Distance: 4 kilometres (an hour at a leisurely pace) from David Balfour Park to The Evergreen Brickworks. Bring at least 1L water, sunscreen protection, a packed lunch if you wish (although there are food concessions at the Brickworks Farmers Market Food Court) and proper footwear. A free Shuttle Bus runs every 30-45 minutes to Broadview Station. TTC service is also available via the 28 Bayview South bus to Davisville subway station. In the afternoon you can extend your hike on the Evergreen Brickworks trail system. You can also opt to join Brad Lennon for a longer hike to complete the loop back to the church via Moore Park Ravine and Mount Pleasant Cemetery. To register for this hike or to ask questions, contact Brad at blennon@sympatico.ca. He's also available at the Sunday 10:30 AM worship service to answer questions.

- **8. WELCOME HOME WORKSHOP:** September is "Welcome Home" month as we return from vacation and start our fall activities. So, it is a perfect time to reflect on what *welcome* really means! Rev. Cathy will be leading welcome home workshops on Sunday, September 15th, one after each of the three services (the workshops are identical). So please join her in the Arthur Smith Room after whichever service you attend, where you will get to know your fellow parishioners—both new and old—and reflect on *welcome* both in practice and in prayer.
- **9. SEASON OF SPIRITUAL RENEWAL DIOCESAN WORKSHOPS:** From September to December, the Diocese is offering many online workshops on a variety of topics how to support the Church's ministry through Scripture, how to make parishes more welcoming to those with disabilities, practical tools for prayer, small group ministry tips, how to equip parents as spiritual nurturers, among others! - **10. CHURCH ON TAP** returns on Friday, September 27th at 7pm. This inclusive, creative Eucharist service has been a part of our community for 10 years! Please join us for worship and stick around after for fellowship and beer.
- **11. PASTORAL CALLS:** An integral part of Christian community is to support one another through times of joy and celebration and also times of grief and confusion. If you or someone you know may benefit from a call or visit from one of our clergy, please reach out to our congregational care team by email at communitycare@christchurchdeerpark.org.
- 12. TRUTH & RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP: This summer, the first residents moved into Caldwell First Nation reserve near Leamington, over 230 years after the Nation lost their traditional land. The Caldwell First Nation was originally based around Point Pelee, an area that in 1790 was subject to a treaty between Indigenous groups and the Crown a treaty that did not include the members of Caldwell First Nation. Settlers gradually took over the land, and the remaining members of Caldwell First Nation were forced out in the 1920s. In 2010, their land claim was finally settled and the Nation was able to begin the process of buying land and establishing their reserve. Caldwell First Nation is also working with Parks Canada on establishing an urban national park in the Windsor area.
- 13. CLIMATE ACTION GROUP: "The Vocation of being a 'protector' ... means protecting all creation, the beauty of the created world, as the Book of Genesis tells us and as St. Francis of Assisi showed us. It means respecting each of God's creatures and respecting the environment in which we live. It means protecting people, showing loving concern for each and every person, especially children, the elderly, those in need, who are often the last we think about. ... In the end, everything has been entrusted to our protection, and all of us are responsible for it. Be protectors of God's gifts!" (from Pope Francis's Inauguration Homily)
