

Now sanctify this water, that your servants who are washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection, to be cleansed and delivered from all sin. Anoint them with your Holy Spirit and bring them to new birth in the family of your

Church, that they may become inheritors of your glorious kingdom.





CCDP WALKING GROUP – CELEBRATING CHRIST'S REIGN ON A SPIRITUAL WALK: The Rev. Dr. Stephen Drakeford and Brad Lennon will lead an 8 km urban hike on the day just before Advent begins, Saturday, November 30. Beginning from the church office doors at 10 a.m., our group will travel by streetcar to the St. Clair West



subway station. Walking from there through the Cedarvale Ravine, we will (at 2.5 km) pass by the Eglinton West station, a drop-out point for those who might wish to return earlier than the rest of the walkers. We shall walk north from Eglinton to follow the Kay Gardner Beltline Trail. **SHARE WARMTH THIS FALL:** Our Community Breakfast program doesn't just feed people: we pass out seasonal essentials such as clothing and boots. **TRUTH & RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP:** On September 30<sup>th</sup>, the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, the Spirit Garden officially opened at Nathan Phillips Square. The garden was developed as a response to Call to Action 82 from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, which calls for a Residential Schools Monument to be established in every capital city to honour the children who attended residential schools. The creation of the memorial was led by the Toronto Council Fire Native Cultural Centre. The garden features a limestone turtle which sits in a reflecting pool on which the names of the 18 residential schools in Ontario are carved. The garden also includes a teaching lodge, a stainless-steel spirit canoe, an inukshuk, and a Three Sisters garden planted with squash, beans, and corn. As well as a space for reflection, the garden will also be used for ceremonies and teaching.
