



- If you prefer to take only the bread, you may indicate this to the cup bearer by crossing your arms over your chest, or simply walking past them.

Stephen Drakeford and Brad Lennon will lead an 8 km urban hike on the day just before Advent begins, <u>Saturday, November 30</u>. <u>Beginning</u> <u>from the church office doors at 10 a.m.</u>, our group will travel by streetcar to the St. Clair West subway station. Walking from there through the Cedarvale Ravine, we will (at 2.5 km) pass by the Eglinton West station, a drop-out point for those who might wish to return earlier than the rest of the walkers. We shall walk north from Eglinton to follow the Kay Gardner Beltline Trail. There will be another dropout point 2.5 km later as we again cross Eglinton to head east back to Yonge Street, then South through Mount Pleasant Cemetery to the church. We can lunch together at one of the restaurants in the Yonge/St. Clair neighbourhood, but bring along on the walk



something to drink. In keeping with our liturgical season, we will walk at a leisurely pace to observe Christ's Reign surrounding us. We will be journeying on mostly flat, well-maintained trails with hard-packed surfaces.

SOCIAL JUSTICE

CLIMATE ACTION GROUP: Canada experienced by far its worst wildfire season on record in 2023. Climate change more than doubled the likelihood of the extreme "fire weather" conditions in eastern Canada in May and June 2023, which helped fires to spread. (World Weather Attribution) Rising temperatures may also increase the likelihood of lightning in the world's northernmost forests, triggering fires. The combined effects of shifting land use and climate change mean extreme wildfires are projected to become more frequent and intense in future globally, according to the UN Environment Programme (UNEP). The number of the most extreme fires may rise by up to 50% by 2100.
