



I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

Stephen: Gracious God, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed

upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love

you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

SOCIAL JUSTICE

CLIMATE ACTION GROUP: ...Climate change is not merely a fossil-fuels problem. It's a spiritual crisis. In this drastically changed and changing scheme, many more of us are going to have to move—not just from the comfortable seat of our physical homes and late-stage capitalism, when they can no longer shelter us, but into a new relationship with nature and with one another. "Lessons for Survival: Mothering Against the 'Apocalypse', Emily Raboteau, (2024), p. 124-125.

TRUTH & RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP: The search for lithium is putting new pressures on Northern Indigenous communities and the demand is being spun into a provincial "mining boom". Ontario has its first ever Critical Mining Strategy (CMS) noting the province is "blessed with exquisite deposits of nickel, lithium, platinum, cobalt and dozens of other strategically important raw materials". The move to "green tech" will seem to have major environmental impacts as explorations continue and the testing is being done on lands belonging to four First Nations: Grassy Narrows, Wapekeka, Neskantaga and Big Trout Lake. The 4 Nations have formed an alliance to defend their lands and waters from this frenzy. Despite the focus on reconciliation these First Nations are protesting that they have been disregarded in the process. LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We acknowledge that the land on which we worship is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee (ho-den-oh-show-nee), and Anishinabek (ah-nish-nah-bek) Nations, and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. This territory is part of the Dish with One Spoon Treaty, an agreement between the Anishinabek, Haudenosaunee, and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes.

Today, Toronto is still home to many Indigenous people from across Turtle Island (North America) and we seek to live in respect, peace, and right relations with them as we meet and worship on this territory. We are grateful for the resources we are using, and honour all the First Nations, Métis, and Inuit people who have been living on this land since time immermorial.
