

#### The Gospel

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him: and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel. 



by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.





- If you prefer to take only the bread, you may indicate this to the cup bearer by crossing your arms over your chest, or simply walking past them.

#### SOCIAL JUSTICE

**CLIMATE ACTION GROUP:** Carbon dioxide (CO2) levels in the Earth's atmosphere have reached levels not seen for millions of years, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) declared in 2022. The last time CO2 levels were this high, more than four million years ago, sea levels were somewhere between five and 25 metres (16-82 feet) higher than they are now, the agency adds. There's enough glacial ice in Greenland alone to raise sea levels about twenty-five feet. Greenland lost a record 12.5 billion tons of ice in just one day in August 2019.

**TRUTH & RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP:** The search for lithium is putting new pressures on Northern Indigenous communities and the demand is being spun into a provincial "mining boom". Ontario has its first ever Critical Mining Strategy (CMS) noting the province is "blessed with exquisite deposits of nickel, lithium, platinum, cobalt and dozens of other strategically important raw materials". The move to "green tech" will seem to have major environmental impacts as explorations continue and the testing is being done on lands belonging to four First Nations: Grassy Narrows, Wapekeka, Neskantaga and Big Trout Lake. The 4 Nations have formed an alliance to defend their lands and waters from this frenzy. Despite the focus on reconciliation these First Nations are protesting that they have been disregarded in the process.
