Bring a lunch, which we will eat at St. Andrew's Church, snacks, water, a hot beverage, and icers/microspikes if it is still icy on the road surfaces. Dress in warm layers appropriate to the weather. We will hike towards Hanlan's Point and return to Ward's Island (the only ferry destination served in the Winter) - approximately 5-6 km each way. Please let Brad know if you intend to join.

COMMUNITY BREAKFAST – LOOKING FOR WINTER CLOTHING: With winter still with us for the foreseeable future, the Breakfast program is asking for your help.

CLIMATE ACTION GROUP: In 2022, Asheville, NC was ranked the number one climate haven people fleeing from climate change could move to. In 2024, it became the site of one of the worst climate disasters in recent memory when Tropical Storm Helene hit on September 27. The storm caused widespread devastation, impacting infrastructure, homes, and businesses.

TRUTH & RECONCILIATION WORKING GROUP: The Committee met several times in February and March. Some people have asked what they can DO towards T and R; some suggestions: 1) download on Google and read the 94 Calls to Action from the Commission, especially #58-#61 regarding the Churches and reconciliation; 2) write to your MP, the Prime Minister and the Governor General to support the repeal of Bill C-273, Section 43—the "spanking law" which justifies "the use of force by way of correction toward a pupil or a child; this is #6 in the Calls to Action." Another meeting was Feb. 27th with Leigh Kern, the "Right Relations Coordinator" in our Diocese. Leigh's focus was the Reconciliation Land Tithe of the Toronto Urban Native Ministry, and the Ministry Allocation Fund. The goal of this initiative is to allocate 10% of monies received through the sale of Anglican Church lands towards indigenous groups. The first year monies began to flow was 2024, and so far \$100,000 has been put toward various indigenous groups through this venture. This is truly a practical part of "Reconciliation." Finally, for anyone wishing to learn more about Reconciliation, the Yellowhead Institute offers free courses online; and Anishinabek Nation.ca via their Education-Resources menu option offers group courses in person and online regarding a number of topics such as Land Back, Settler/Indigenous History, the Calls to Action, and more.
